1 User instructions

1.1 About this operating manual

This operator's manual is an integral part of the machine control unit.

The operator's manual contains important instructions for **safe**, **proper** and **economic use** and **maintenance** of the machine control unit. Compliance with its stipulations helps to **avoid risks**, reduce repair costs and downtime and to increase the reliability and service life of the machine controlled with it.

The operator's manual must be kept in an easily accessible location close to where the machine control unit is used (e. g. on the tractor).

The operator's manual does not replace your **own responsibility** as operator and operational staff of the machine control unit.

1.2 Significance of warnings

The warning instructions in this manual have been structured according to the degree of danger and the probability of their occurrence.

Danger signs and symbols inform the user about other construction-related and unavoidable residual risks that may be encountered when operating the machine. The warning notes used are structured as follows:

1.6 Menu hierarchy, keys and navigation

Menus are the entries listed in the Main menu window.

In the menus, **submenus and/or menu items** are listed in which settings can be implemented (selection lists, text or number entries, starting a function).

The various menus and buttons of the machine control unit are illustrated in **bold** letters:

The hierarchy and the path to the requested menu item are marked with an > (arrow) between menu, menu item/s:

- System / test > Test/diagnosis > Voltage means that you can access the Voltage menu item via the System / test menu and the Test/diagnosis menu item.
 - The arrow > corresponds to the operation of the **scroll wheel** and/or the button at the screen (touch screen).

2 Layout and function

NOTICE

Due to the great variety of different ISOBUS-compatible terminals, this chapter is restricted to the functions of the electronic machine control system without indicating a specific ISOBUS terminal.

• Please observe the instructions on the operation of your ISOBUS terminal in the corresponding operator's manual.

2.1 Overview of supported AXIS fertiliser spreaders

Supported functions

- Spreading depending on forward speed
- Electrical drop point adjustment

2.2 Display

The display shows the current status information as well as the selection and input options for the electronic machine control unit.

The most important information concerning the operation of the mineral fertiliser spreader is displayed in the **operating screen**.

2.2.1 Operating screen description

NOTICE

The exact representation of the operating screen depends on the actual settings selected and on the machine type.




Figure 2.1: Machine control unit display

- [1] Current application rate from the fertiliser settings or the task controller Button: direct entry of the application rate
- [2] Fertiliser information display (fertiliser name, working width and spreading disc type) Button: Adjustment in the fertiliser chart
- [3] Metering slide position, right/left
- [4] Drop point position, right/left
- [5] TELIMAT application rate adjustment
- [6] Metering slide opening status, right/left
- [7] PTO speed
- [8] Function keys
- [9] Freely definable display fields
- [10] Mineral fertiliser spreader display
- [11] Selected operating mode
- [12] Display of boundary/border settings

2.2.2 Display fields

The three display fields in the operating screen (Figure 2.1, Position [9]) can be individually adjusted and optionally assigned with the following values:

- Forward speed
- Flow factor (FF)
- ha trip
- kg trip
- m trip
- residual kg
- m left
- ha Rest
- Empty run (time until the next empty run measurement)
- Torque for the spreading disc drive




Figure 2.2: Display fields

- [1] Display field 1
- [2] Display field 2
- [3] Display field 3

Select display

- 1. Press the corresponding **display field** in the touch screen.
 - > The available options are listed on the display.
- 2. Select the new value which is to be assigned to the display field.
- 3. Press the **OK button**.
 - The operating screen is displayed. The respective display field displays the new value.

2.2.3 Display of the metering slide states




Figure 2.3: Display of the metering slide status

- [A] Spreading operation inactive (STOP)
- [1] Section deactivated
- [2] Section activated
- [B] Machine in spreading mode (START)
- [3] Section deactivated
- [4] Section activated



You can **immediately deactivate an entire spreading side** during limited border spreading. To do this press the softkey for further section reduction over 500 ms. This is particularly useful in field corners to ensure a quick spreading operation.

2.2.4 Display of sections




Figure 2.4: Display of the section status

- [1] Section width / limited border spreading toggle key
- [2] Reduce right section button
- [3] Activated sections on entire working width
- [4] Right section is reduced by several partial sections

NOTICE

We recommend that you restart the terminal in the following cases:

- If you have changed the working width.
- If you have opened a different fertiliser chart entry.

After restarting the terminal, the display of the section widths is adjusted to the new settings.



3 Attachment and installation

3.1 Requirements for the tractor

Before installing the machine control unit, ensure that your tractor meets the following requirements:

- A minimum voltage of 11 V must always be guaranteed, even if multiple loads are connected simultaneously (e.g. air conditioning system, lights),
- Oil supply: max. 210 bar, single or double-acting valve (depending on equipment),
- AXIS-M: The PTO speed must amount to 540 rpm as a minimum requirement and it must be maintained (one basic requirement for a correct working width).

NOTICE

On tractors without a load-switchable transmission, the forward speed must be selected by using the correct gear ratio in such a way that it corresponds to a PTO speed of **540 rpm**.

- 9-pin socket (ISO 11783) located at the rear of the tractor, for connecting the machine control unit to ISOBUS.
- 9-pin terminal plug (ISO 11783) for connecting an ISOBUS terminal to the ISOBUS.

NOTICE

If the tractor is not equipped with a 9-pin socket at the rear, a tractor assembly set including a 9-pin socket for the tractor (ISO 11783) and a forward speed sensor may be purchased additionally as special equipment.

3.2 Connections, sockets

3.2.1 Power supply

The power supply of the machine control unit is implemented via the 9-pin socket at the rear of the tractor.


3.3 Connecting the machine control unit

Depending on the equipment, there are different methods for connecting the machine control unit to the mineral fertiliser spreader. Further information can be obtained from the operator's manual of your machine control unit.

3.4 Metering slide preparation

The AXIS EMC mineral fertiliser spreaders are equipped with an electronic metering slide actuator which is used to adjust the spreading quantity.

NOTICE

Observe the operating manual for your mineral fertiliser spreader.

4 Operation AXIS EMC ISOBUS

A CAUTION



Risk of injury due to ejected fertiliser

In the case of a fault, it is possible that the metering slide unexpectedly opens during road transport to the spreading location. There is a risk of slipping and personal injury due to ejected fertiliser.

▶ Before leaving for the place of spreading, the electronic machine control unit must always be switched off.

NOTICE

The operating manual describes the functions of the machine control unit **from software version 3.30.00**.

NOTICE

The settings in the individual menus are very important for optimal automatic mass flow control (EMC function).

Please be particularly aware of the specifics of the EMC function for the following menu items:

- in the Fertiliser settings menu
 - Spreading disc. See <u>Page 33</u>.
 - Spreading disc speed and/or PTO speed. See <u>Page 33</u>.
- In the Machine settings menu
 - AUTO / MAN mode. See Page 43 and chapter [5].

4.1 Activating the machine control unit

Requirements:

- The machine control unit is correctly connected to the machine and the tractor (for example, see chapter 3.3: Connecting the machine control unit, page 18).
- A minimum voltage of 11 V is guaranteed.
- 1. Start the machine control unit.
 - After a few seconds, the **start-up screen** of the machine control unit is displayed.
 - Shortly after, the machine control unit displays the **Activation menu.**
- 2. Press the Enter key.
- > The operating screen is then displayed.



4.2 Navigation within the menu

NOTICE

You can find important information about the display and the navigation between menus in Chapter 1.6: Menu hierarchy, keys and navigation, page 3.

In the following, accessing menus and menu items by touching the touch screen or pressing the function keys is described.

Follow the operating manual for the terminal used.

Accessing the main menu



- Press the operating screen / main menu function key. See <u>2.3.2: Menus</u>, page <u>12</u>.
 - > The main menu is displayed.

Accessing the sub-menu via the touch screen:

1. Press the button of the desired sub-menu.

Windows appear prompting various actions.

- Text input
- Value input
- Settings are made in further sub-menus

NOTICE

Not all parameters are displayed simultaneously in one menu window. You can use the **left** / **right arrow keys** to switch to the next or previous window.

Exiting menus



- Confirm settings by pressing the back key.
 - You will return to the previous menu.



- Press the operating screen / main menu key.
 - > You will return to the **operating screen**.



- Press the ESC key.

 - > You will return to the **previous menu**.




Figure 4.1: Main menu with sub-menus




Figure 4.2: Fertiliser settings menu AXIS-M, tabs 1 and 2




Figure 4.3: Fertiliser settings menu, tabs 3 and 4

4.4.1 Application rate



In this menu, you can enter the desired target value for the application rate.

Entering the application rate:

- 1. Open the Fertiliser settings > Appl. rate (kg/ha) menu.
 - > The **currently applied** application rate is displayed.
- **2.** Enter the new value in the input field.
- 3. Press OK.
- > The new value is saved in the machine control unit.

You can also input and adjust the application rate directly through the operating screen.

- 1. Press the Application rate [1] button on the touch screen.




Figure 4.4: Entering the application rate on the touch screen

- [1] Application rate button
- [2] Fertiliser chart button
- 2. Enter the new value in the input field.
- 3. Press OK.
- > The new value is saved in the machine control unit.

4.4.2 Working width



You can set the working width (in meters) in this menu.

- 1. Open the Fertiliser settings > Working width (m) menu.
 - > The **currently set** working width is displayed.
- 2. Enter the new value in the input field.
- 3. Press OK.
- > The new value is saved in the machine control unit.

4.4.3 Flow factor



The flow factor is within the range of **0.2** and **1.9**. With constant basic settings (km/h/, working width, kg/ha), the following applies:

- If the flow factor is increased, the application rate is decreased.
- If the flow factor is decreased, the application rate is increased.

An error message is displayed if the flow factor is outside the preset range. See <u>6</u>: Alarm messages and possible causes, page 81.

If you are spreading organic fertiliser or rice, the minimum factor has to be reduced to 0.2. Otherwise the error message will be displayed constantly.

If the flow factor has been obtained from earlier calibrations or from the fertiliser chart, enter it **manually** in this selection window.

NOTICE

In the **Start calibration** menu, the flow factor can be determined and entered with the help of the machine control unit. See Chapter <u>4.4.5</u>: <u>Calibration</u>, <u>page 30</u>.

With the AXIS-H EMC mineral fertiliser spreader, the flow factor is calculated via the EMC mass flow control. However, the data can also be entered manually.

NOTICE

The flow factor calculation depends on the operating mode used. For further information on the flow factor, please refer to chapter 4.5.1: AUTO/MAN mode. page 43.

Entering the flow factor:

- 1. Open the Fertiliser settings > Flow factor menu.
 - The currently set flow factor is displayed.
- 2. Enter the value obtained from the fertiliser chart into the input field.

NOTICE

Should the fertiliser you use not be included in the fertiliser chart, then enter the flow factor as **1.00**.

In the **AUTO km/h operating mode**, we highly recommend implementing a **calibration** in order to be able to accurately determine the flow factor for this fertiliser.

- 3. Press OK.
- ▶ The new value is saved in the machine control unit.

NOTICE

It is recommended that you have the flow factor displayed on the operating screen when using the AXIS EMC mineral fertiliser spreader (operating mode **AUTO km/h + AUTO kg**). This allows you to monitor the flow factor control during the spreading. See 2.2.2: <u>Display fields</u>, page 8

Minimum factor

The machine control unit automatically sets the minimum factor to one of the following values in accordance with the entered flow factor value:

- The minimum factor is 0.2 if the input value is smaller than 0.5.
- The minimum factor is reset to 0.4 as soon as you enter a value exceeding 0.5.

4.4.4 Drop point



NOTICE

Entering the drop point with the **AXIS-M 20.2 EMC** is merely informative and does not affect the settings of the fertiliser spreader.

In this menu, you can enter the drop point for information purposes.

- 1. Open the Fertiliser settings > Drop point menu.
- 2. Determine the position for the drop point using the fertiliser chart.
- 3. Enter the determined value in the input field.
- **4.** Press the **Enter key**.
- > The Fertiliser settings window with the new drop point is displayed.

4.4.5 Calibration



NOTICE

The **Start calibration** menu is locked in the **AUTO km/h + AUTO kg** operating mode for all weighing spreaders and for all machines. This menu item is inactive.

In this menu, the flow factor can be determined based on a calibration and saved in the machine control unit.

Execute the calibration:

- before spreading for the first time.
- if the fertiliser quality has changed significantly (moisture, high dust content, granulate damage).
- if a new fertiliser type is used.

The calibration must either be conducted with a running PTO at a standstill or while driving over a test section.

- Remove both spreading discs.
- Move the drop point to the calibration position (value 0).

Entering the working speed:

- 1. Open the **Fertiliser settings > Start calibration** menu.
- **2.** Enter the average working speed.

This value is required to calculate the slide position during the calibration.

- **3.** Press the **Continue** button.
 - > The new value is saved in the machine control unit.
 - > The second calibration page is displayed.



Selecting the section:

- **4.** Determine which spreader side the calibration will be carried out on.
 - Press the function key of the left side of the spreader or
 - the function key of the **right** side of the spreader.
- > The symbol indicating the selected spreader side will be lit with a red light.

A WARNING



Risk of injury during the calibration

Rotating machine components and ejected fertiliser may cause injury.

- ▶ **Before starting** the calibration, ensure that all requirements have been met.
- ► Read the **Calibration** chapter in the machine operating manual.

5. Press Start/Stop.The metering start

The metering slide of the previously selected section width opens and the calibration starts.

NOTICE

The calibration can be stopped at any time by pressing the **ESC** key. The metering slide is closed and the display screen shows the menu. **Fertiliser settings** menu is displayed.

NOTICE

The calibration time is not relevant when it comes to the accuracy of the results. However, **a minimum of 20 kg** must be spread during the calibration.

- 6. Press Start/Stop again.
 - > The calibration ends.

 - The third page of the calibration is displayed.

Recalculating the flow factor

WARNING



Risk of injury due to rotating machine parts

START STOP

▶ Before actuating the **Start/Stop** key, ensure that **nobody** is present in the danger zone of the machine.

4.4.6 Spreading disc type

NOTICE

For an **optimal idle measurement**, check that the information in the **Fertiliser settings** menu is correct.

The data contained in the spreading disc and normal disc speed and/or
 PTO menu entries must comply with the actual settings of your machine.

The mounted spreading disc type is factory pre-programmed in the control unit. If you have mounted different spreading discs on your machine, you must ensure that the correct type is entered in your control unit correspondingly.

- 1. Open the Fertiliser settings > Spreading disc menu.
- **2.** Select the spreading disc type from the list and activate it.
- ▶ The Fertiliser settings window with the new spreading disc type is displayed.

4.4.7 PTO speed

NOTICE

For an **optimal idle measurement**, check that the information in the **Fertiliser settings** menu is correct.

• The entries in the **Spreading disc** and **PTO shaft** menu items must comply with the actual settings of your machine.

The specified PTO speed is preset in the control unit to 750 rpm as a standard factory setting. If you want to set a different PTO speed, you must change the value stored in the control unit.

- 1. Open the Fertiliser settings > PTO menu.
- 2. Enter the RPM.
- The display shows the Fertiliser settings window with the new PTO speed.

NOTICE

Please observe chapter <u>5.5: Spreading with the AUTO km/h + AUTO kg operating mode</u>, page <u>68</u>.

4.4.8 Limited border spreading quantity



You can set the quantity reduction (as a percentage value) in this menu. This setting is used to activate the limited border spreading function.

NOTICE

We recommend reducing the quantity on the limited border spreading side by 20%.

Entering the limited border spreading quantity:

- 1. Open the Fertiliser settings > Bound.quantity menu.
- **2.** Enter the value in the input field and confirm.
- > The fertiliser settings window with the new bound.quantity is displayed.

4.4.9 Calculate OptiPoint



In the **Calculate OptiPoint** menu, you can enter the parameters to calculate the optimum turn on and turn off distances in the headlands.

It is very important to enter the distance factor of the fertiliser used to obtain an exact calculation.

Please refer to the fertiliser chart of the machine to find the distance factor for the fertiliser used.

- 1. Enter the prescribed value in the **Fertiliser settings > Distance factor** menu.
- 2. Open the Fertiliser settings > Calculate OptiPoint menu.




Figure 4.5: Calculate OptiPoint, page 3




Figure 4.7: Fertiliser charts menu




Figure 4.8: Managing the fertiliser chart via the touch screen






Figure 4.9: Machine settings menu, page 1 and 2

4.5.1 AUTO/MAN mode

The machine control unit automatically controls the metering quantity according to the forward speed signal. The application rate, working width and flow factor are all taken into account here.

By default, the unit operates in **automatic** mode.

The manual mode is only used:

- if there is no speed signal (radar or wheel sensor not available or defective),
- when slug pellets or seeds (fine seeds) are spread.

NOTICE

To ensure regular spreading of the spreading material in manual operating mode, it is imperative that you work at a **constant forward speed**.

You can restore the default settings with the C 100 % key.

Determine the quantity reduction:

- 1. Open the Machine settings > +/- Appl. rate (%) menu.
- **2.** Enter the percentage by which you want to adjust the spreading quantity.
- 3. Press OK.

4.6 Fast emptying



Select the **Fast emptying** menu to quickly clean the machine after the spreading or to quickly empty any residual material.

For this purpose, before storing the machine, we recommend **completely opening** the metering slides via the fast emptying function and switching off the AXIS EMC ISOBUS in this state. This prevents a build-up of moisture in the hopper.

NOTICE

Before starting the fast emptying process, it is to be ensured that all preconditions have been met. Observe the operating manual for the mineral fertiliser spreader (discharging the remaining quantity).

With the AXIS-M 20.2, the drop point must be mechanically zeroed before the fast emptying takes place (See also "Drop point" on page -29).

Carrying out the fast emptying process:

1. Open the Main menu > Fast emptying menu.

With the **AXIS EMC**, the **Move to drop point** alarm notification appears. By pressing the **Start/Stop** function key, the drop point is automatically moved to position 0. 


Figure 4.10: Fast emptying menu




Figure 4.11: System/test menu




Figure 4.12: Total data counter menu




Figure 4.13: Test / Diagnosis, example: Metering slide




Figure 4.14: Test / Diagnosis, example: Linbus




Figure 4.15: Weighing trip counter menu




Figure 4.16: Trip counter menu




Figure 4.17: kg Left menu

In this menu, the SpreadLight function can be activated and the spreading pattern can be monitored even in the night mode.

The operating lights are switched on and off via the machine control unit when in automatic and manual mode.




Figure 4.18: SpreadLight menu

The AXIS EMC machine is equipped with an electrically operated hopper cover. During the refilling process at the end of the field, you can open and / or close the hopper cover using the control unit and an electrical drive.

The menu is only used for activating the actuators to open or close the hopper cover. The machine control unit AXIS EMC ISOBUS does not detect the exact position of the hopper cover.

• Monitor the movements of the hopper cover.




Figure 4.19: Hopper cover menu

Material damage due to insufficient clearance

Moving the hopper cover

- 3. Press the Open hopper cover key.
 - During the movement, an arrow is displayed which indicates that the cover is **OPENING**.
- 4. Fill with fertiliser.



- 5. Press the Close hopper cover key.
 - During the movement, an arrow is displayed which indicates that the cover is **CLOSING**.



If required, you can stop the movement of the hopper cover by pressing the **Stop**-key. The hopper cover remains in the intermediate position until you close or open it fully.

4.12 Special function: Using the joystick

As an alternative to the settings on the operating screen of the ISOBUS terminal, you can also use a joystick. See <u>7: Optional equipment, page 87</u>. The joystick offered is pre-programmed with specific functions at the factory.

NOTICE

If you wish to use a different joystick, please contact your dealer.

Please observe the instructions in the operator's manual of the ISOBUS terminal.




Figure 4.20: Key assignment, level 1 (LED is red)




Figure 4.21: Key assignment, level 2 (LED is yellow)




Figure 4.22: Key assignment, level 3 (LED is green)

5 Spreading with the machine control unit AXIS EMC ISOBUS

The machine control unit **AXIS EMC ISOBUS** helps you to make the right machine settings before starting to work. During spreading, the functions of the machine control unit are also active in the background. This allows you to monitor the quality of the fertiliser spreading.

5.1 Calling up the remaining quantity during spreading (weighing spreader only)

During spreading, the residual quantity is continuously recalculated and displayed.

During spreading, i.e. with the metering slides open, the **trip counter** menu can be opened to display the remaining quantity currently in the hopper.

NOTICE

If you want to constantly monitor the values during the spreading, freely assignable display fields in the operating screen can also be assigned with the **kg left**, **ha left** or **m left**, see Chapter 2.2.2: Display fields, page 8.

Working with the weighed remaining quantity, refilling the hopper:

- **1.** Zero the scales.
 - See chapter 4.9.3: Zero scales (weighing spreaders only), page 55.
- **2.** Select the fertiliser type used.
 - See chapter 4.4.11: Fertiliser charts, page 38.
- **3.** Fill the hopper.
- **4.** Weigh the fertiliser quantity in the hopper.
- **5.** Start your work.
 - When the hopper is empty, refill it.
- 6. Repeat steps 3 to 5.

5.2 Refilling (weighing spreader only)

Requirements:

The kg level sensor function in the Machine settings menu is active.

NOTICE

If the menu entry is not displayed in your machine control, please contact your salesperson or customer service.

If the refill weight exceeds 400 kg, check the residual weight via the automatically displayed window.



Figure 5.1: Refill weight



- Press the **ACK** foil key prior to spreading.
- Continue spreading.

NOTICE

If a WLAN module is being used, then the app also displays the weight.

5.3 Remote-controlled limited border spreading unit TELIMAT with AXIS-M 20.2 EMC

A CAUTION



Risk of injury due to the automatic adjustment of the TELI-MAT!

By pressing the **TELIMAT key**, the unit is automatically moved to the boundary spreading position by an electrical actuating cylinder. This can cause personal injury and damage to property.

▶ Before pressing the **TELIMAT key**, make sure that no one is in the machine's hazard zone.

NOTICE

The TELIMAT option is pre-set on the machine control unit by default!

TELIMAT with hydraulic remote control



The TELIMAT is hydraulically moved to its working or idle position. The TELIMAT unit can be activated or deactivated by pressing the **TELIMAT key**. Depending on the position, the display shows or hides the **TELIMAT icon**.

TELIMAT with hydraulic remote control and **TELIMAT** sensors

If TELIMAT sensors are connected and activated, the **TELIMAT icon** is shown on the display of the control unit as soon as the TELIMAT has been hydraulically brought to the operating position. If the TELIMAT is moved back to the idle position, the **TELIMAT icon** is hidden. The sensors monitor the TELIMAT adjustment and activate or deactivate the TELIMAT automatically. With this variant, the **TELIMAT key** has no function.

If the status of the TELIMAT unit cannot be detected for a period of more than 10 seconds, Alarm 14 will appear; see Chapter 6.1: Meaning of the alarm messages, page 81.

5.4 Working with sections

5.4.1 Displaying the spreading type on the operating screen

The machine control unit offers 2 different spreading modes for spreading operations using the AXIS EMC machines. These settings can be configured directly on the operating screen. During the spreading operation, you can change between the different spreading types in order to ideally adapt to the field requirements.

Button	Spreading type
+ / +	Activate section on both sides
* / •	Section width on the left, limited border spreading function on the right possible

1. Press the function key several times until the desired spreading type is displayed.

5.4.2 Spreading with reduced sections

Spreading can be realized with sections on one or both sides so that the spreading width can be adjusted to the field requirements. Every spreading side can be adjusted by a maximum of 2 steps in automatic and manual mode.

• Press the Change limited border spreading/spreading sides key.






Figure 5.2: Operating screen, 2 section widths

NOTICE

- Each section can be reduced or increased in steps.




Figure 5.3: Automatic section control (AXIS-M 20.2)

- Section control is possible from the outside to the inside. See <u>Figure 5.3</u>.

We recommend that you restart the terminal in the following cases:

- If you have changed the working width.
- If you have opened a different fertiliser chart entry.

After restarting the terminal, the display of the section widths is adjusted to the new settings.

- 1. Press the Reduce left spreading width or the Reduce right spreading width function key.
 - The section of the spreading side will be reduced by one step.
- 2. Press the Increase left spreading width or the Increase right spreading width function key.
 - The section width of the spreading side is increased by one level.

NOTICE

The sections widths are not graded proportionally. The VariSpread spreading width wizard automatically adjusts the spreading widths.

5.4.3 Spreading operation with one section and in boundary spreading mode

During spreading operation, the sections can be changed gradually and limited border spreading can be deactivated. The figure below shows the operating screen with activated limited border spreading and activated section widths.




Figure 5.4: Operating screen, one section width on the left, limited border spreading side on the right

- Press the C/100% function key to immediately restore the full working width.
- By pressing the **Right limited border spreading** function key, the limited border spreading function is deactivated.

NOTICE

The limited border spreading function is also possible in automatic mode with GPS-Control. The limited border spreading side must always be operated manually.

5.5 Spreading with the AUTO km/h + AUTO kg operating mode



The **AUTO km/h + AUTO kg** operating mode allows for a continuous regulation of the application rate during the spreading operation. The mass flow control regulation is corrected at regular intervals based on this information. This way, fertiliser metering can be optimised.

NOTICE

The AUTO km/h + AUTO kg operating mode is pre-selected in the factory.

Prerequisites for spreading:

- The AUTO km/h + AUTO kg operating mode is active (refer to 4.5.1: AU-TO/MAN mode, page 43).
- The fertiliser settings are defined.
 - Application rate (kg/ha)
 - Working width (m)
 - Spreading disc type
 - Normal disc speed (RPM)

Proceed as follows:

1. Fill the hopper with fertiliser.

WARNING



Danger due to ejected fertiliser

Ejected fertiliser may cause severe injury.

- ► Make sure that there is no-one in the spreading zone of the machine before switching on the spreading discs.
- 2. Acknowledge alarm messages by pressing the enter key. See <u>6.1: Meaning</u> of the alarm messages, page <u>81</u>.

 - The idle measurement starts automatically. See <u>5.6: Idle measurement.</u> page 69.
- 3. Press Start/Stop.
- ▶ The spreading starts.

NOTICE

We recommend displaying the flow factor on the operating screen (see <u>2.2.2:</u> <u>Display fields, page 8</u>) in order to monitor the flow factor control while spreading.



NOTICE

In the event of a problem with the regulating behaviour of the flow factor (blockages, ...), after troubleshooting at a standstill, switch to the **Fertiliser settings** menu and enter the flow factor 1.0.

Resetting the flow factor

If the flow factor has fallen below the minimum value (0.4 and/or 0.2), alarm no. 47 and/or 48 appears. See <u>6.1: Meaning of the alarm messages</u>, page <u>81</u>.


5.6 Idle measurement

5.6.1 Automatic idle measurement

In order to achieve a high level of control accuracy, the EMC control must regularly measure and store the idling pressure.

The idle measurement for the determination of the idling pressure will automatically start when the system is restarted. In addition, it starts automatically and under the following conditions:

- The defined period since the last idle measurement has expired.
- If you have made changes in the **Fertiliser settings** menu (RPM, spreading disc type).



During the idle measurement, the following window is displayed.

Figure 5.5: Idle measurement alarm display

 At the first start of the spreading disc, the machine control unit checks the oil temperature of the transmission. See <u>6.1</u>: <u>Meaning of the alarm messages</u>. <u>page 81</u>.

NOTICE

If the alarm message is displayed repeatedly even though the transmission oil is warm:

- Compare the installed spreading disc with the type entered in the **Fertiliser settings** menu. If required, adjust the type.
- Check the spreading disc for tight seat. Re-tighten the wheel nut
- Check the spreading disc for damage. Replace the spreading disc.
- Once the idle measurement has been completed, the machine control unit will set the idling time to 19:59 minutes, which will be displayed on the operating screen.

1. Press Start/Stop.

- The idle measurement runs in the background, even if the metering sliders are closed. However, no screen is shown on the display.

NOTICE

When the spreading disc speed is reduced, **no** idle measurement can be performed if limited border spreading or the section reduction is activated!

NOTICE

When the metering slides are closed, an idle measurement is always carried out in the background (without an alarm message)!

NOTICE

Do not reduce the engine speed during the idle measurement in the headlands! The tractor and hydraulics circuit must have reached their operating temperature!

5.6.2 Manual idle measurement

In the event of any unusual changes in the flow factor, start the idle measurement manually.

- Press the idle measurement key in the Main menu.

5.7 Spreading in the AUTO km/h operating mode



This operating mode is applied by default for machines without a weighing system.

Prerequisites for spreading:

- The AUTO km/h operating mode must be active (see 4.5.1: AUTO/MAN mode, page 43).
- The fertiliser settings are defined.
 - Application rate (kg/ha)
 - Working width (m)
 - Spreading disc type
 - Normal disc speed (RPM)
- 1. Fill the hopper with fertiliser.

NOTICE

In order to achieve an optimal spreading result when working in **AUTO km/h** operating mode, a calibration must be carried out before spreading starts.

2. Carry out a calibration to determine the flow factor

or

Take the flow factor from the fertiliser chart and enter it manually.

A WARNING



Danger due to ejected fertiliser

Ejected fertiliser may cause severe injury.

▶ Before activating the spreading discs, ensure that nobody is present in the spreading zone of the mineral fertiliser spreader.



- 3. Press Start/Stop.
- > The spreading starts.

5.8 Spreading in the MAN km/h operating mode



If there is no speed signal available, then you work in the MAN km/h operating mode.

- 1. Open the Machine settings > AUTO / MAN mode menu.
- 2. Select the MAN km/h menu item.
 - > The **Speed** input window is displayed.
- 3. Enter the value for the forward speed during spreading.
- 4. Press OK.
- **5.** Configure the fertiliser settings:
 - Application rate (kg/ha)
 - Working width (m)
- **6.** Fill the hopper with fertiliser.

NOTICE

In order to achieve an optimum spreading result in the MAN km/h operating mode, a calibration is to be carried out before starting the spreading.

7. Carry out a calibration to determine the flow factor

or

Take the flow factor from the fertiliser chart and enter it manually.



- 8. Press Start/Stop.
- ▶ The spreading starts.

NOTICE

Always observe the set speed during spreading.

5.9 Spreading in the MAN scale operating mode



The **MAN scale** operating mode enables the metering slide opening to be manually adjusted during the spreading operation.

The manual mode is only used:

- if there is no speed signal (radar or wheel sensor not available or defective),
- when spreading slug pellets or fine seeds.

The operating mode **MAN scale** is suitable for slug pellets and fine seeds since the automatic mass flow control cannot be activated due to the low weight reduction.

NOTICE

To ensure regular spreading of the spreading material in the manual operating mode, it is imperative that you work at a **constant forward speed**.






Figure 5.7: MAN scale operating screen

In order to achieve an optimal spreading result in manual mode as well, it is recommended that you adopt the metering slide opening and forward speed values provided in the fertiliser chart.



5.10 GPS Control



The AXIS EMC ISOBUS machine control unit can be combined with an ISOBUS terminal with SectionControl. Various data is exchanged between both devices to automate the control.

The ISOBUS terminal with SectionControl transmits the specifications regarding the opening and closing of metering slides to the machine control unit.

The symbol **A** next to the spreading wedges indicates that the automatic function is enabled. The ISOBUS terminal with SectionControl opens and closes the individual sections depending on the respective position in the field. The spreading starts only after pressing **Start/Stop**.

A WARNING



Risk of injury due to ejected fertiliser

The SectionControl function automatically starts the spreading operation without warning. Ejected fertiliser may lead to injury of the eyes and nasal mucous membrane. There is also a risk of slipping.

► Ensure that nobody is present in the danger zone during the spreading operation.

During spreading, **one or several sections** can be closed at any time. If the sections are activated for automatic operation again, the last state requested is restored.

If the ISOBUS terminal with SectionControl changes from automatic to manual mode, the machine control unit closes the metering slides.

NOTICE

In order to use the GPS Control functions of the machine control unit, the **GPS Control** setting has to be activated in the **Machine settings** menu!




Figure 5.8: Spreading operation display on the operating screen with GPS Control

The **OptiPoint** function calculates the optimal on and off points for spreading in the headlands based on the settings in the machine control unit; see <u>4.4.9: Calculate OptiPoint</u>, page 35.

NOTICE

To ensure correct configuration of the OptiPoint function, enter the correct distance factor for the fertiliser being used. The distance factor can be obtained from the fertiliser chart for your machine.

• See 4.4.9: Calculate OptiPoint, page 35.

Switch-on distance (m)




Figure 5.9: Switch-on distance (relating to field border)

Switch-on distance refers to the switch-on distance (<u>Figure 5.9</u> [A]) relating to the field border (<u>Figure 5.9</u> [C]). At this position in the field, the metering slides start to open. This distance depends on the type of fertiliser and represents the ideal switch-on distance for optimised fertiliser distribution.

If the switch-on position in the field is to be changed, the **switch-on distance** has to be adjusted.

- A lower distance value means that the switch-on position is closer to the field border.
- A greater value means that the switch on position is closer to the centre of the field.

Switch-off distance (m)




Figure 5.10: Switch-off distance (relating to field border)

Switch-off distance refers to the switch-off distance (<u>Figure 5.10</u> [B]) relating to the field border (<u>Figure 5.10</u> [C]). At this position in the field, the metering slides start to close.

If you wish to turn beyond the headland track, enter a greater distance in **Switch-off distance**.

Here, the adjustment must be as low as possible so that the metering slides close as soon as the tractor enters the headland track. An adjustment of the switch off distance may lead to an insufficient fertilisation in the area of the switch off position in the field.




Figure 6.1: Alarm message (example)

Terms/conditions of warranty

RAUCH units are manufactured with modern production methods and with the greatest care and are subject to numerous inspections.

Therefore RAUCH offers a 12-month warranty subject to the following conditions:

- The warranty begins on the date of purchase.
- The warranty covers material and manufacturing faults. Our liability for third-party products (hydraulic system, electronics) is limited to the warranty of the manufacturer of the equipment. During the warranty period, manufacturing and material faults are corrected free of charge by replacement or repair of the affected parts. Other rights extending beyond the above, such as claims for conversion, reduction or replacement for damages that did not occur in the object of supply are explicitly excluded. Warranty services are provided by authorised workshops, by RAUCH factory representatives or the factory.
- The following are excluded from coverage by the warranty: natural wear, dirt, corrosion and all faults caused by improper handing and external causes. The warranty is rendered void if the owner carries out repairs or modifications to the original state of the supplied product. Warranty claims are rendered void if RAUCH original spare parts were not used. Therefore, the directions in the operating manual must be observed. In all cases of doubt contact our sales representatives or the factory directly. Warranty claims must be submitted to the factory by 30 days at the latest after occurrence of the problem. The date of purchase and the serial number must be indicated. If repairs under the warranty are required, they must be carried out by the authorised workshop only after consultation with RAUCH or the company's appointed representatives. The warranty period is not extended by work carried out under warranty. Shipping faults are not factory faults and therefore are not part of the warranty obligation of the manufacturer.
- No claims for compensation for damages that are not part of RAUCH machines themselves will be accepted. This also means that no liability will be accepted for damage resulting from spreading errors. Unauthorised modifications of RAUCH machines may result in consequential damage, for which the manufacturer will not accept any liability. The manufacturer's liability exclusion will not apply in case of wilful intent or gross negligence by the owner or a senior employee, and in cases where according to the product liability law there is liability for personal injury or material damage to privately used objects in the event of defects in the supplied product. It will also not apply in the event that assured properties are absent, if the purpose of the assured properties was to protect the purchaser against damage that does not involve the supplied product itself.
